Carving a chasm through Canyonlands National Park, the red-rock wonder of Cataract Canyon begins at the confluence of the mighty Green and Colorado Rivers. Experience the mighty Colorado River canyon's splashy thrills on this classic three-day rafting adventure. Journey over 50 miles in the depths of Cataract Canyon through Canyonlands National Park, tackling "the Big Drops" like Satan's Gut and Little Niagara Falls-famed as some of the world's best rapids. Enjoy exhilarating days of stand-up paddle boarding and camping beneath desert skies. Kick off this trip in Moab, Utah's adventure hub, and it with a scenic flight from Lake Powell back over Cataract Canyon, the gateway to the Grand Canyon. See below for a sample itinerary of your day-to-day activities.

Itinerary

DAY 1 ARRIVE IN MOAB & FLATWATER RAFT THE COLORADO RIVER

Arrive in Moab, Utah's lively adventure hub, and meet your MT Sobek Trip Leader for a continental breakfast welcome orientation. Ride to the Cataract Canyon put-in at Potash Boat Ramp. Meet your other guides by the river and receive a safety briefing before the journey begins. Adjust to the pace of the warm Colorado River as you motor past spectacular scenery. Stop to explore Native American ruins and learn about the flora and fauna of this fragile desert environment. Upon arrival at camp, join the guides in setting up tents and play fun river games like horseshoes and bocce ball. After dinner, watch the sunset to the chirp of the canyon wren.

DAY 2 WHITEWATER RAFT THE BIG DROP RAPIDS & SHORT HIKE

After breakfast, pack up and motor past the confluence of the Green and Colorado Rivers. Accessibility through this stretch allows for perhaps the Loop Hike — a short, steep 1-mile hike with majestic vistas. Meanwhile, the rafts continue downriver to prepare your post-hike lunch by the river. Prepare to face some of the best rapids in the world! Known as "the Big Drops," these classic rapids, including Satin's Gut and Little Niagara Falls, provide heaps of adrenaline-fueled fun. This evening, camp on a sandy beach under a rich blanket of stars — Canyonlands National Park is recognized as one of the few Dark Sky Parks. Let the guides surprise you with riverside festivities.

DAY 3 HALF DAY RAFTING, TAKE-OUT & SCENIC FLIGHT TO MOAB

Awake for your last day on the river, which features only a half-day of rafting - about 20 miles on the river through one of the most spectacular canyon stretches. The towering walls rise higher as you get deeper and approach Lake Powell, just upstream of the Grand Canyon. At the take-out, enjoy a riverfront lunch and transfer to the Hite Airstrip, where a charter flight whisks you up and over Canyonlands National Park and the Colorado River. Upon landing, a vehicle is waiting to transport your group back to Moab.
